Professor Nigel Roberts



Nigel Roberts is Professor of political science at Victoria University. He was an official advisor to the Electoral Referendum Panels that were established to ensure that official information in the 1992 and 1993 electoral systems referendums was accurate, fair and unbiased, and he was also an official advisor to the New Zealand Electoral Commission for the 2011 electoral systems referendum and the 2012 review of MMP. Nigel Roberts has lectured and written extensively about New Zealand politics. Many of us will have seen him on election nights, when he has provided expert commentary on radio and television for more than 30 years. The title of his talk is "Mrs Shipley's Confession: The Mysterious Case of MMP". It promises to be stimulating, informative and topical.

The National Archive of Film, Television and Sound



Our speakers at our first quarterly meeting on Thursday 15 February were two staff from Nga Taonga Film and Vision, the National Archive of Film, Television and Sound. They told us about the work of the Archive and its plans to progressively digitize selected parts of its huge sound and image collection. They also explained how best to look after old film and sound recordings. There were several questions about the care of sound and visual items at home, including old film and videotapes. They told us about the information and guidance on caring for audio and visual items available through their website.
